Hilario most recently served as the Chief Operations Officer of Einstein Noah Restaurant Group, a leading company in the quick casual restaurant industry that operates locations primarily under the Einstein Bros.(R) Bagels and Noah's New York Bagels(R) brands and primarily franchises locations under the Manhattan Bagel(R) brand.

From April 2004 through May 2009, Hilario served as McCormick & Schmick's Chief Financial Officer and as a Director from May 2007 through July 2009. For the preceding four years, he was with Angelo and Maxie's, Inc. (formerly Chart House Enterprises, Inc.) most recently as Chief Financial Officer.

From December 1997 until April 2000, Hilario was with ACCO Brands Inc., a then wholly owned subsidiary of Fortune Brands, where he held various senior level positions including Corporate Controller and Group Director of Cost Management. Previously, he spent nine years with McDonald's Corporation in functions spanning from operations, marketing, finance and strategy development.

He is the founder and majority owner of Blame It On The Chef LLC, an Oregon based restaurant Development Company that provides both strategic support and growth capital to restaurant operating partners and currently operates in Oregon City, OR The Rivershore Bar and Grill.
